The BFBL York County Chapter was launched by the York County Agriculture Business Council in 2010 and evolved into an independent organization led by a volunteer executive committee. In 2018, the BFBL York County executive committee assumed an additional role—supporting efforts of the York County Food Alliance

to build a healthy community where everyone has access to food produced in ways that protect and strengthen our environment and local economy.

OUR MISSION IS SIMPLE — to connect the people of York County to locally produced food and farm products through education on where to find locally grown products and why it's a great idea to do so, as well as promoting our Partners who have made a commitment to support farms in York County.

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About This Guide

This Local Food Guide includes detailed information for the 2023-2024 Buy Fresh Buy Local® York County Chapter Partners. The purpose of this Guide is to connect consumers to the freshest and most delicious local food and keep our family farms strong in York County. To be featured in this Guide, a business must sell food primarily grown by themselves or another York county farmer/grower, must provide a service or product that includes the use of locally grown or raised products, OR must offer menu items using ingredients grown on a local farm.

Again this year, there is a colored map (page 20) with icons showing Partner locations as well as farmers who participate in the Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP).

Use this Guide often to find new places to visit and support the local food movement.

Helpful Terms Used in This Guide

Certified Organic: The producer and their products have been U.S. Department of Agriculture-certified to follow ecological standards excluding the use of synthetic pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, growth hormones, and routine antibiotics.

CSA: Community Supported Agriculture allows you to buy "shares" in a farm's harvest in advance. Most CSA's require an annual or quarterly buy-in and provide weekly deliveries or pick-ups of whatever vegetables (and sometimes fruit, eggs, meat, or flowers) are ready for market that week

Farm Market: A retail outlet normally owned and operated by a farm unit, generally located on the farm and selling products produced by the farm.

Farmers Market: An established area where several farmers/growers gather on a recurring basis to sell a variety of fresh produce as well as other farm products.

Free Range: Method of farming where the animals are allowed to roam freely instead of being confined closely or caged. May apply to meat, eggs, or dairy.

Homegrown: A product was grown on the premises of the farm that is selling it.

Local: In this guide, "local" refers to farms located in York County.

Organic: Non-chemical farming and food processing. Farmers generally don't use synthetic chemicals, genetically engineered seeds or products, growth hormones, or routine antibiotics in their farming practices.

Pasture Raised or Grass Fed:

This meat, dairy, and poultry comes from animals raised primarily on a diet of freshly grazed pasture during the growing season and stored grasses (hay or grass silage) during winter months. Generally not given growth hormones or additives.

Raw: Generally refers to milk and dairy products that are not pasteurized or homogenized.

Roadside Stand: Generally is a seasonal, temporary structure located on or near a farm selling produce grown on the farm.

Sustainable: The farmer strives for harmony with the natural environment, and considers issues of human health, societal and economic wellbeing without sacrificing the ability to earn profit.

Four Reasons to Buy Local Food



TASTE

Farm-fresh fruits and vegetables taste great because they are grown for flavor and picked at the peak of ripeness. Most produce sold in grocery stores, on the contrary, is grown to withstand long-distance travel and have a long shelf life.



HEALTH

Locally grown food may be more nutritious. Fruits and vegetables grown on York County farms usually arrive at market within 24 hours of harvest, still full of nutrients. Products from grass-fed, pasture-raised livestock are often more flavorful and health enhancing.



COMMUNITY

Visiting a BFBL Partner can contribute to a sense of community. Get to know the people who grow your food. Learn more about our local entrepreneurs. Enjoy time with family and friends!



FAMILY FARMS

There's never been a more critical time to support our local farmers. Spending money on locally produced food and farm products helps ensure that family farms in York County continue to be profitable and available for future generations.



Farmers' Market Nutrition Program: Seniors and WIC Participants

The Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) provides eligible seniors and WIC participants with checks to buy Pennsylvania-grown fresh fruit and vegetables from participating local farm markets. The checks are redeemable at eligible markets between June 1, 2023 and November 30, 2023. See page 7 for a list of markets.



This program is sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging and the Community Progress Council – WIC

(Women, Infants and Children) office, in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the PA Department of Agriculture, and the PA Department of Health.

Seniors

Eligible seniors can get a one-time \$50 check per calendar year. To be eligible, seniors must be York County residents, be 60 years of age by December 31, 2023, and have a total gross annual 2023 household income at or below:

o 1 person: \$26,973o 2 people: \$36,482o 3 people: \$45,991o 4 people: \$55,500

WIC Participants

Pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, AND children between the ages of 1 and 5 years are each eligible to get a one-time \$20 check per calendar year. To apply for WIC benefits, or ask questions about the FMNP vouchers, call 717-843-7942. PA WIC is funded by USDA. This institution is an equal opportunity provider.

What's in Season?

Buying fruits and vegetables in season can lower the cost. Buying produce at a local market, fresh from the farm, adds to the freshness and taste! Below is a partial list of produce grown in Pennsylvania. Keep in mind that some local farmers use growing methods like "hoop houses" to grow and harvest select produce for longer periods of time.

How to Shop a Farmers Market

- ▶ **Come with cash.** Credit cards are generally not accepted, and not all vendors take personal checks.
- **Go early.** Arrive near opening time to enjoy the widest selection.
- **▶ Or come late.** You may find some of the best deals near closing time.
- ▶ **BYOB:** Bring Your Own Bags. Many vendors keep costs low by not offering bags, so bring your own.
- ▶ **Pack a cooler.** If you're going to spend time at the market rather than hurrying home to the fridge, or if it's a really hot summer day, a cooler with ice helps keep perishable items fresh.
- ▶ **Think beyond fruits and veggies.** Many stands have fresh meats, jams, preserves, raw milk, eggs, cheeses, honey, flowers, and delicious prepared foods. Explore and enjoy!
- ► Talk to the farmers. Who better to ask how to prepare or store food than the person who grew it?
- ▶ Give the kids a few bucks. Let kids choose and purchase some items. Kids are more willing to eat healthy foods they pick out themselves, and it's a fun way to establish life-long healthy habits!

Support the York County Food System

- ☑ Start small. Spending just \$10 a week at a BFBL Partner can have a huge impact.
- ☑ Shop at a local market. Look for locally produced fruits, vegetables, honey, wine, meats, eggs, flowers, and more!
- ☑ Consider investing in a CSA (Community Supported Agriculture).
- ☑ Visit a local winery or distillery.
- ☑ Dine at restaurants that serve locally grown foods.
- \square Look for locally produced specialty products at markets or locally owned retailers.

"Quick-Freeze" Basics

Freezing is a great way to save money and enjoy your favorite summertime fruits and vegetables throughout the fall and winter months. Berries, bell peppers, and onions are the easiest types of produce to freeze. Follow these three easy steps.

1. Prepare Produce

- o For *berries*: Sort berries throwing out moldy ones. Trim any soft spots off strawberries. Rinse the fruit and remove any leaves and stems.
- o For *bell peppers*: Rinse and remove the stem and seeds; dice or slice into strips.
- o For *onions*: Peel and cut yellow, white, or sweet onions into desired size diced, chopped, or wedges.

2. Quick Freeze

o Spread prepared produce in a single layer on flat pans or baking sheets; and pat gently with paper towels to remove any excess moisture. Freeze until firm.

3. Package & Freeze

o Transfer firm produce to freezer-safe bags or containers and remove extra air. Label and date each package and return to the freezer.

Tips: Loosen and remove the amount of frozen product needed and return the rest to the freezer. | Add thawed berries to oatmeal, yogurt, cottage cheese and ice cream. | Add chopped onions and bell peppers to scrambled eggs and other cooked dishes like pasta sauce and soups. No thawing needed!

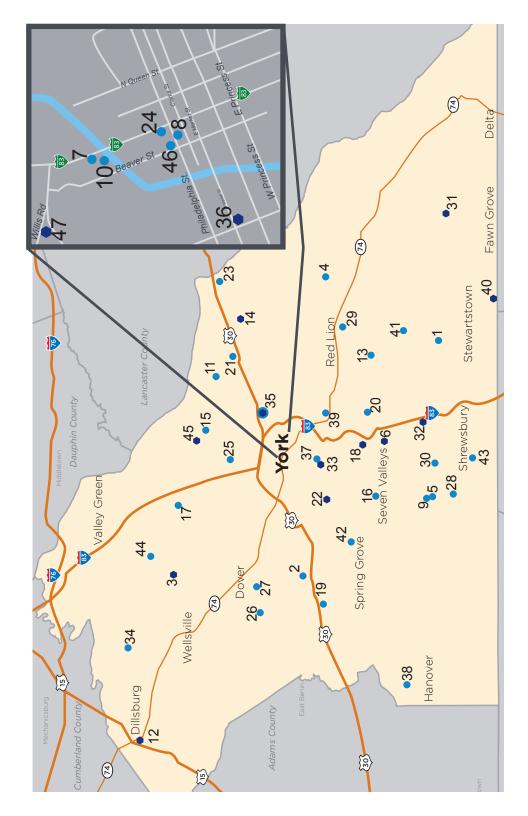

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Eat a Rainbow of Colors

To be sure you get all the nutrients you need for good health, eat a rainbow of colors. Health benefits from eating fruits and vegetables vary by color:

RED: Healthy heart and memory.

Red foods include apples, cranberries, grapes, pomegranates, raspberries, strawberries, watermelon, tomatoes, red grapefruit, radishes, radicchio, red peppers, and red onions.

ORANGE/YELLOW: Healthy immune system, vision, and heart.

Orange/yellow foods include apricots, sweet potatoes, pineapple, mangoes, oranges, apples, peppers, pumpkin, corn, lemons, cantaloupe, peaches,nectarines, and persimmons.

GREEN: Vision, strong bones, and teeth.

Green foods include kale, apples, grapes, kiwi, honeydew, avocado, broccoli, spinach, collards, okra, artichoke, zucchini, lettuce, celery, cucumber, beans, and asparagus.

PURPLE/BLUE: Healthy aging, heart, and memory.

Purple/blue foods include blackberries, plums, blueberries, figs, eggplant, purple cabbage, grapes, elderberries, and aronia berries.

WHITE: Healthy immune system, heart, and blood pressure.

White foods include bananas, cauliflower, mushrooms, onions, garlic, potatoes, white currants, white peaches, and white nectarines.

Roasting Fresh Vegetables Tips

If you don't like veggies or are looking for a new way of cooking your favorites... try roasting! Roasting vegetables helps to enhance their natural sweetness.

Basic roasting directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° to 375° for soft vegetables, 400° to 450° for root vegetables. Some recipes will call for even higher oven temperatures.
- 2. Cut vegetables into uniform shape and size.
- 3. Toss vegetables with canola or olive oil, about 1-2 teaspoon.
- 4. Season to taste with your choice of salt, pepper, garlic, spices, and/or herbs.
- 5. Place vegetables in a single layer on a sheet pan. Do not crowd the vegetables as this will cause them to steam.
- 6. Bake until vegetables are fork-tender, turning half way through cooking time—about 15-20 minutes for soft vegetables like zucchini and 25-30 minutes for root vegetables like carrots.

Try these combinations: (add salt and pepper to taste)

- ▶ Asparagus and red bell peppers
- ▶ Broccoli and garlic with crushed red pepper
- ▶ Broccoli and green beans
- ▶ Butternut squash and apples with pumpkin pie seasoning
- ▶ Butternut squash and sweet onion with dried herbs de Provence
- ▶ Cabbage wedges and onion
- ➤ Carrots and red bell pepper with minced garlic
- ➤ Cauliflower and carrots with dried herbes de Provence

- ➤ Corn (sliced off the cob), zucchini, and red bell peppers
- ▶ Yellow squash, zucchini, and sweet onion
- ➤ Zucchini, mushroom, and onion with Italian seasoning



Fresh from the Farm Stand Recipes

SUMMER SAUCE

Ingredients:

- o 1½ tablespoons (T) oil
- o 2 garlic cloves, sliced
- o 1 can pureed or crushed tomatoes
- o 1 teaspoon dried basil
- o 1 teaspoon dried oregano

Makes 6 servings

Directions:

- 1. Add ½ T oil to a medium pot over medium heat. Add garlic and cook until browned.
- Add can of tomatoes, basil and oregano. Stir and bring to a boil. Lower heat and cook about 15 minutes

- o 1 eggplant, chopped-with the skin on
- o 1 onion, chopped
- o 1 zucchini, chopped-with the skin on
- o 1 cup mushrooms, chopped
- 3. In a large frying pan, heat remaining oil over medium heat. Add chopped vegetables and cook until vegetables become soft. Stir often.
- Add tomato sauce to cooked vegeta-4. bles and continue to cook over low heat for 15 minutes
- 5. Serve over pasta or rice. Enjoy!
- Refrigerate or freeze leftovers.

Make Half Your Plate Fruits and Vegetables!

Be sure to choose a variety of colorful fruits and veggies, and prepare them in healthful ways: steamed, sautéed, roasted, or raw. Try these tips to help you eat plenty of veggies and fruits:

- ☑ Add seasonal fruit to leafy greens or baby spinach for a side salad.
- ☑ Add your favorite fruit to oatmeal, cereal, cottage cheese, or yogurt.
- ☑ Plan some meals around a vegetable main dish, such as a vegetable stir-fry or soup.
- ☑ Include a green salad with your dinner every night.

- ☑ Shred carrots or zucchini into meatloaf, casseroles, quick breads, and muffins.
- ☑ Include chopped onions, sweet peppers, zucchini, yellow squash, and/or tomatoes in pasta sauces or lasagna.
- ☑ Use shredded or pureed vegetables such as zucchini or carrots in pasta sauces or soups.

Storing Fresh Fruits and Vegetables

For best flavor, store the fresh fruits and vegetables listed below using the helpful tips. Enjoy your purchase of locally grown farm-fresh produce throughout the year by preserving them. Learn how to freeze, dehydrate, or can your favorite and vegetables.

FRESH PRODUCE	STORING TIPS
Apples	Can be stored at room temperature, but they will last up to six weeks if refrigerated. Do not refrigerate in closed bags.
Asparagus	Refrigerate and use within two or three days. Wrap a moist paper towel around the stem ends, or stand upright in 2 inches of cold water.
Beets	Cut off most of the stems and greens and store unwashed in the refrigerator crisper for two to four weeks.
Berries	Refrigerate blueberries for up to two weeks or freeze unwashed berries. All other berries refrigerate for up to three days.
Broccoli	Refrigerate in a closed plastic bag for up to one week.
Cauliflower	Tightly wrap and refrigerate unwashed, head-down in the crisper drawer, away from fruit.
Cherries	Refrigerate, unwashed and loosely-packed in a plastic bag up to one week.
Corn	Refrigerate corn with husks up to three days. If the husk has been removed, place the corn in a plastic bag.
Cucumbers	Refrigerate up to one week in a sealed plastic bag in the refrigerator.
Eggplant	Store uncut and unwashed in a sealed plastic bag in the refrigerator for up to a week.
Green Beans	Refrigerate unwashed in plastic to prevent moisture loss and wilting.
Leafy Greens	Wrap bunches in slightly damp paper towels, and place in the refrigerator in a plastic bag with holes for air.
Melons	Keep whole melons in the refrigerator or a cool place for up to five days. Cut melon in an airtight container will last three to five days.
Peaches, Plums & Nectarines	Ripen at room temperature. Once ripened, store in a plastic bag in the refrigerator for up to five days.
Pears	Ripen at room temperature for two to three days. Once ripened, store in the refrigerator for up to one week.
Peppers	Store whole peppers in a sealed plastic bag in the refrigerator for up to one week.
Peas, Sugar Snap	Refrigerate, unwashed, in a plastic bag for up to one week.
Potatoes	Store potatoes away from sunlight in a plastic bag with holes or in a burlap bag.
Squash, Summer	Store in a plastic bag in the refrigerator for two to three days.
Tomatoes	Store unripened tomatoes at room temperature out of direct sunlight, stem down. Use within a few days.

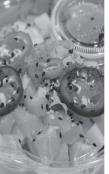

This summer enjoy **bell pepper** – a yummy vegetable that can be eaten raw or cooked! Bell peppers are an excellent source of Vitamin C. In fact, one large red pepper has three times more Vitamin C than an orange.

Simple Serving Tips:

- → Whisk finely chopped bell peppers with eggs before cooking scrambled eggs.
- → Sauté chopped bell peppers, zucchini, onions, and a sprinkle of cumin in a small amount of oil. Eat as a side dish or add to your favorite enchilada, burrito, or quesadilla recipes.
- → Enjoy sliced bell peppers for a snack or with lunch. Try dipping them in hummus.
- → Toss sliced bell peppers in a marinade (try a low-fat balsamic or Italian salad dressing) and grill or roast until tender crisp. Try combining with other veggies, like zucchini, onions, and/or eggplant. They're delicious!

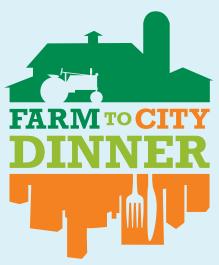

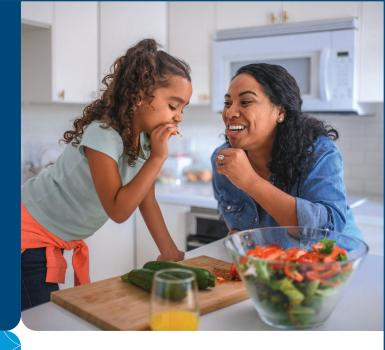
